FREE Exhibition in Gallery 31
May 26–June 19, 2011**

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The special exhibition *Expressions 2011: Art by D.C. Youth* will showcase the art and creativity of young people involved in the Corcoran Gallery of Art and College of Art + Design’s award-winning ArtReach program, which extends the resources of the Corcoran to Washington, D.C. communities through free after-school and summer art classes. Using the Corcoran’s collections as a primary resource, ArtReach fosters visual literacy, critical thinking skills, and creative expression while encouraging young people to develop meaningful connections between art and their lives.



Expressions 2011, on view from **May 26 to June 19 in Gallery 31** – the Corcoran’s free exhibition space – marks the 19th anniversary of the Corcoran ArtReach program. Inspired by visits to the Corcoran’s recent temporary exhibitions, *Spencer Finch: My Business, With the Cloud* and *Washington Color and Light*, ArtReach students created vibrant works that explore and celebrate themes such as community, creativity, the language of abstraction, motion, color, environment, and identity.

“The Corcoran is premised on the idea that art should be accessible and inclusive to everyone. Creativity assists students to experience the world in a dynamic and innovative way. *Expressions 2011* showcases a vibrant display of student work and exemplifies a truly unique dialogue between the Corcoran’s collections and its surrounding community,” said Melissa Green, director of community partnerships at the Corcoran.

The multimedia installation – which comprises drawing, painting, screenprinting, poetry, and sculpture represents the creativity and breadth of our community – will open with a reception for students, families, and guests at the Corcoran Gallery of Art on **May 26 from 6 to 8 p.m. in Gallery 31.**

Corcoran ArtReach is a year-round, museum outreach program designed to empower DC youth and families to explore and trust their own creativity within the context of art appreciation and art making.
