American Journeys—*Visions of Place* is a new installation of the Corcoran's renowned pre-1945 American paintings and sculpture collection that conveys the changing notion of place in the history of American art. Featuring more paintings— approximately 110—than have ever been on view in the galleries of historic American art, and for the first time in over a decade integrating paintings and sculpture for a total of 125 works on view, the reinstallation reflects the Corcoran's commitment to American art.

With the acquisition of William A. Clark's collection in 1926, the Corcoran's role in the study of European art improved dramatically in quality and prominence. While small and eclectic by contemporary museum standards, the European collection now represents a wide range of historic and aesthetic ideas and styles, making it ideal for teaching.
