WASHINGTON, D.C. - The Corcoran Gallery of Art and College of Art + Design presents NEXT at the Corcoran

2013 (April 6–May 19, 2013), a dynamic, interactive, and innovative presentation of work by the graduating students of the Corcoran College of Art + Design. The exhibition is a unique and special opportunity for Corcoran College of Art + Design students to exhibit their work in the main galleries. Admission to *NEXT* is free.

NEXT includes both an exhibition of the thesis work of the Bachelor of Fine Arts class of 2013 and a showcase of the Bachelors and Masters of Arts degree programs at the

The six BFA majors—Digital Media Design, Fine Art, Graphic Design, Interior Design, Photography, and Photojournalism—are represented in diverse forms of expression, including paintings, photographs, installations, video, animation, sculpture, and performance, reflecting today's contemporary art world as well as the possibilities of the each area of practice.

The Corcoran's Bachelor of Arts in Art Studies program hones the skills needed to excel professionally in today's creative economy by developing a knowledge base of contemporary art, new media, the history of art, creative and analytical writing, museum practices, and critical theory. BA students present their work as part of a full schedule of programs and presentations.

Graduates of the Master of Arts programs join in the month-long celebration that is *NEXT*. Work from emerging professionals in Exhibition Design, New Media Photojournalism, Interior Design, Teaching, Art Education, and Art and the Book will be presented.

Alongside the Corcoran's contemporary program, <u>NOW at the Corcoran</u>, the student exhibition confirms the Corcoran's commitment to showcasing emerging artists. For more than 120 years, the Corcoran has trained the next generation of artists—as well as art and design professionals—while displaying the most important works of the time.

"NEXT showcases the Corcoran's promising young artists, designers and photographers, showing their work at the very moment they move from aspiring to professional artists," said Catherine Armour, provost and chief academic officer of the Corcoran College of Art + Design. "The exhibition celebrates these talented individuals at the outset of their careers and reinforces the quality and uniqueness of the Corcoran educational experience. The opportunity to exhibit in this way, combined with our decision to freeze tuition rates for the 2013-2014 academic year, are just two of the important ways the Corcoran College of Art + Design distinguishes itself as a platform for the next generation of visual artists and scholars."

Design Lab, the Corcoran's innovative undergraduate course that works as an in-house design studio, created the exhibition's visual identity, including gallery, collateral and soon-to-launch Web design elements.

The Corcoran will host a private breakfast on Wednesday, April 3 from 9 a.m.-11 a.m. in advance of the public opening for press and gallerists to view the work and to meet student artists.

The opening of NEXT 2013 coincides with the launch of Corcoran Portfolios (http://portfolios.corcoran.edu/), a

web-based portfolio network for Corcoran students, faculty, alumni, and staff to share projects and gain recognition. Corcoran Portfolios is powered by Behance (part of the Adobe family), which is a sponsor of *NEXT*. Alex Krug, Head of Business Development,

Behance, stated, "The Corcoran is known nationwide for its College and its Gallery, and we're excited to partner with them on the launch of their portfolio network—and honored to support *NEXT*."

Visitors to *NEXT* have the unique opportunity to observe thesis critiques—discussions between the artists and their peers and instructors—to gain insights into the artists' intentions and observe this aspect of the art-school experience firsthand. In addition to thesis critiques, the public is invited to attend a series of lectures, including those offered as part of the *NEXT at the Corcoran* Gallery Talk Series.
